VOICE OF FAITH

Be Perfect_

As my title indicates, this article is about the word 'perfect' as used in our scriptures. My problem with this word began when I was a youth. It was during the days of 'house visitation.' I was fourteen at the time of the 'visit' in question. At the end, the minister asked if anyone had a question. I did. I asked about Jesus' words in Matthew 5:48,

"Ye therefore shall be perfect, as your heavenly Father is perfect." ASV My question was, God knows we can't be sinless, so why does he command us this? The minister's answer was that is a goal laid out for us. But that never sat well with me. The question remained.

Phillip Yancey struggled with the same question. In his book The Jesus I Never Knew. Chapter 7 Message: Sermon of Offense, he outlines that struggle. In the first paragraph of this chapter, we read: Long after I came to recognize the enduring truth of the Beatitudes, I brooded over the uncompromising harshness of the rest of the sermon. Its absolutist quality left me gasping. "Be perfect as your heavenly Father is perfect" ... Be perfect like God? Whatever did he mean?"

The answer, I found later when I became a minister and able to refer to the Greek, lies in a word Matthew used to convey Jesus' teaching. Bear in mind, we use 'perfect' in a number of ways. In a rather meaningless way, we say 'That's perfect' when we like something or agree with an idea. We seldom use 'perfect' to express sinlessness, except when we talk about Jesus. We use the word perfect far more in talking about fruit or vegetables. 'That tomato is perfect.' "The cauliflower was perfect.' It's at the peak of maturity, ready for use. It is perfectly mature, perfectly ripened.

To convey this later meaning of Jesus, Matthew chose the word he did. The Greek word he used is teleios. Thayer's Lexicon gives its meaning as: brought to its end, finished; lacking nothing necessary to completeness; perfect.

Strong defines teleios (tel'-i-os) as complete (in various applications of labor, growth, mental and moral character, etc.); neuter completeness.

Jesus was not teaching us to have the goal of sinlessness, he was teaching us to be full-grown, ripe, mature, and ready for use, as a full-grown vegetable or fruit is perfect, ready for use.

Peter used a different Greek word, but he caught the heart of Jesus' teaching. He wrote: Therefore, rid yourselves of all malice and all deceit, hypocrisy, envy, and slander of every kind. Like newborn babies, crave pure spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow up in your salvation, now that you have tasted that the Lord is good. 1 Peter 2:1-3 NIV



Peter, like Jesus, lays before us the goal of growth, i.e. growing in our relationship with the Lord.

- B. Deacons: Preparing for July 28th town hall; awaiting technology bids. Emphasized improved communication for town hall meetings.
