Monthly Musings From Pastor Ryan

"Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; the whole earth is full of God's glory" (Isaiah 6:3), the prophet Isaiah hears in a vision in which God's glory fills all the earth, not just the temple space in which he stands. God's glory touches everything from the smallest of creatures to the heavens above. God's glory becomes the new normal, should anyone have the eyes and ears to notice it.

What an amazing vision and revelation! Indeed, only a poet like Isaiah could do it any justice. So, what if it really were true? What if God's glory truly does fill all the earth? Imagine every morning waking up and seeing everything and everyone you encounter as being touched by God's grace. The sky above our heads that brings us wind and rain and the passing of the seasons would be holy. The sun in the sky that gives us light and warmth would be holy. Friends and family who care for and about us would be holy. Strangers who make things, create art, grow our foods, and make their way in life just as we all do, would be holy. All these things would be holy not in and of themselves but because they had been touched and even blessed by God and God's glory and God's holiness.

What if? What if we could see everything in this life as being touched by God's holy hand? Maybe we wouldn't take so much for granted. Maybe we, as a society and a world, would take better care of our natural resources and the earth. Maybe we would really begin to see everyone as neighbors and children of a loving God, regardless of skin color, religion, sexuality, or borders. Maybe we might find little joys and even a little holiness in everyday experiences like sitting with a friend, greeting a stranger, or just watching the sky be transformed like the canvas of a fine artist, creating one masterpiece after another, day after day after day.

So often, we can easily miss such small, holy moments. Whether we get distracted by worries or our smartphones, it can be easy to miss that God is with us always, and God is always calling out to us, just as God did with Isaiah. We go to church, we worship, maybe we get recharged for the week ahead, and then once we're back at home, school, or work, we might think we're attuned to God and doing God's will, but we miss out on God's presence. We don't hear God's voice amid all the noise. We see the brokenness and the busyness of life, and we miss the glory and the holiness.

Oftentimes, we equate holiness and glory with what we might call the otherness, mystery, and transcendence of God. Holiness is always beyond us. Holiness is up there, just out of reach. Glory and holiness, we all too often assume, is what we get but brief tastes of here in this life but will be our eternal reward in the next.

Isaiah's vision, however, invites us to look for God's glory and holiness not just up there but all around us and in the lives of others. All of which again begs the question, "What if it is true that the whole earth, including all people, are full of God's glory?" What if we were to see everyone as being touched by God's holy hand? Might we not be so quick to judge others? Might we be a little more inclined to think of others first? Might we feel a need to understand others a little better? Might we go a little easier on our own selves and not get trapped into thinking that our own value and worth are dependent on performance, efficiency, and accomplishment? If anything, perhaps we might come to see that God's glory and holiness doesn't put God way up in heaven and beyond our reach. Instead, God's holiness is all around us. God is present in every minute and every second of our days. And God, as God did with the prophet Isaiah, calls out to each of us to see, honor, and promote that holiness wherever it is found.

Sometimes, in God's eyes, the new normal is really not that much different from the old normal. Sometimes the new normal is just another opportunity to live more fully into the holiness that God has already blessed us with. Sometimes, if we begin to more fully live as though the truth were true, what becomes normal is the fact that we are to treat one another and all creation as holy.

Vestry Minutes from Monday, May 10, 2021

Treasurer's Report: A financial report was given and will be filed for audit. Taxes for the parsonage do not match the rules of the Dept of Revenue. After inquiring, Rich received a response from the Dept of Revenue to start an appeal at the county level in April 2022.

Deacons' Report: Deacons serve as ushers during the in-person services.

Elders' Report: A meeting date needs to be determined to plan performance reviews. The pastor also sent out a manual for Pastor Parish Relations to the Elders.

Trustees' Report: Mark Odell obtained an estimate on roof replacement from the PolyVinyl Roofing of Mt Vernon for under \$25,000. To move forward, information will need to be shared with the congregation followed by a congregational vote. Mark Odell will contact Polyvinyl to find out their availability.

Pastor Ryan's Report:

- In-person services started on May 2, with an average of 30 attendees and more online.
- The church could benefit from a mic system that will work when someone joins a Zoom meeting remotely.
- New members: Lisa Shea, Bev & Eric Knoernschild
- Pastor's father-in-law passed away. Pastor Ryan wants to take bereavement leave for the funeral the weekend of May 15-16. Tom Emerick will cover on May 16.
- The pastor will schedule time off for June 14-18 and other dates to be determined.
- Pentecost will be the first Communion Sunday. Pastor plans on having pre-cut bread.
 He will wear gloves and social distance.


Unfinished Business

- Capital Improvement Planning Committee Updates
- Carpeting/flooring The plan includes carpet for the main floor with planking for the lower level, landing, and steps.
- Downstairs restrooms A bid was received from Scott Carver for \$16,825.
- Solar A second bid from Moxie will be requested.
- Roof PolyVinyl from Mt. Vernon is considered.
- Ways to fund the capital improvements have been discussed. One possible scenario is a 50-50 match from Endowment.

New Business

- Update on building and in-person gathering policies. The pastor was asked how long he might wear his mask. He is comfortable wearing his mask because it reduces aerosols.
- Pastor asked permission to purchase for the church an iPad and case, Multimedia iRig, and supercharger for the camera. Mark Butterworth made a motion to purchase the equipment. Mark Odell second. Motion carried.
- Outdoor worship on June 20 will be held at Faith UCC. Pastor tested the WiFi at Discovery Park and found that WIFI is not available at the shelter.
- MCSA/First Presbyterian Housing Campaign will match donations up to \$30,000. How
 could Faith raise funds to help? Pastor Ryan will schedule Scott to come and speak.
- Summer VBS is being led by Beth Elshoff, Christian Ed Director. We may be collaborating with First Christian.
- Proposal to add new front yard church sign to capital improvement planning. Any sign
 would be pleasing to the eye, include the message of open and affirming, and reconfigure the name so the United Church of Christ is on one line. One board member encouraged the use of an electronic sign. Sue made a motion to add the front-yard sign to the
 capital improvement plan. Second by Alice Ganzley. Motion carried.
